## NATURE OF PROCEEDINGS: ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 30-2020

Effective this date, pursuant to authorization granted by the Chief Justice of California, Chair of the Judicial Council, the Superior Court of California, County of Shasta orders the time period provided in Penal Code §1382 for the holding of a criminal trial extended by not more than 30 days applicable only to cases in which the initial or previously extended statutory deadline otherwise would expire from 11/20/20 to 12/23/20, inclusive.

This order is made as a result of the local widespread condition of COVID-19 and in consideration of the rising positivity rate of the virus in Shasta County. This order is in compliance with the recommendations made by the California Department of Public Health to reduce the size of gatherings and maintain social distancing of six feet.

# SUPERIOR COURT OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF SHASTA

GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 AND STATEWIDE EMERGENCY ORDERS ISSUED BY CHAIR OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL

Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115, the proclamations of states of emergency by federal, state, and local officials, and the March 23, 2020 and April 9, 2020 Orders ("Orders") of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the November 18, 2020 renewed request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of Shasta County ("Court"), this Court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

1. In cases in which the statutory deadline would expire from November 20, 2020, to December 23, 2020, inclusive, the Court may extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code within which a trial must be held by not more than 30 days from the last date on which the statutory deadline would otherwise have expired.

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.

#### THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, leading to health and safety concerns and resulting in substantial operational impediments, and the proclamations of states of emergency by federal, state, and local officials, it was determined on March 17, 2020, March 23, 2020, and April 9, 2020, that the conditions described in Government Code section 68115 were met with regard to the Superior Court of California, County of Shasta (Court). Based on those determinations, and at the request of Presiding Judge Daniel Flynn, three prior emergency orders issued authorizing the Court to implement certain relief under Government Code section 68115. Upon the renewed request of Presiding Judge Flynn, it is determined that the conditions described in Government Code section 68115(a) continue to exist (Gov. Code, § 68115(c)), and it is ordered that the Court is authorized to do the following:

• Extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code (section 1382) for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the initial or previously extended statutory deadline otherwise would expire from November 20, 2020, to December 23, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(10); Executive Order N-38-20 (03-27-20)).
